

## *Message of the Holy Father for Lent 2003*

*Dear Brothers and Sisters!*

Lent is a season of intense prayer, fasting and concern for those in need. It offers all Christians an opportunity to prepare for Easter by serious discernment about their lives, with particular attention to the word of God which enlightens the daily journey of all who believe. This year, as a guide for our Lenten meditation, I would offer a phrase taken from the Acts of the Apostles: «It is more blessed to give than to receive» (Acts 20:35). ...

Our age, regrettably, is particularly susceptible to the temptation toward selfishness which always lurks within the human heart. In society generally, and in the media, people are bombarded by messages which more or less openly exalt the ephemeral and the hedonistic. ... Faced with the tragic situation of persistent poverty which afflicts so many people in our world, how can we fail to see that the quest for profit at any cost and the lack of effective, responsible concern for the common good have concentrated immense resources in the hands of a few while the rest of humanity suffers in poverty and neglect? Appealing to believers and to all people of good will, I would like to reaffirm a principle which is self-evident yet often ignored: our goal should not be the benefit of a privileged few, but rather the improvement of the living conditions of all. Only on this foundation can we build that international order truly marked by justice and solidarity which is the hope of everyone.

*«It is more blessed to give than to receive».* When believers respond to the inner impulse to give themselves to others without expecting anything in return, they experience a profound interior satisfaction. The efforts of Christians to promote justice, their commitment in defence of the powerless, their humanitarian work in providing bread for the hungry

and their care for the sick by responding to every emergency and need, draw their strength from that sole and inexhaustible treasury of love which is the complete gift of Jesus to the Father. Believers are called to follow in the footsteps of Jesus Christ, true God and true man, who, in perfect obedience to the will of the Father, emptied himself (cf. Phil 2:6 ff), and humbly gave himself to us in selfless and total love, even unto death on a cross. Calvary eloquently proclaims the message of the Blessed Trinity's love for human beings of all times and places. ...

The Son of God loved us first, while «we were yet sinners» (Rom 5:6), with an unconditional love which asks nothing in return. If this is so, how can we fail to see the season of Lent as a providential opportunity to make courageous decisions inspired by altruism and generosity? Lent offers us the practical and effective weapons of fasting and almsgiving as a means of combating an excessive attachment to money. Giving not only from our abundance, but sacrificing something more in order to give to the needy, fosters that self-denial which is essential to authentic Christian living. Strengthened by constant prayer, the baptized reveal the priority which they have given to God in their lives....

It is my fervent hope that believers will find this Lent a favorable time for bearing witness to the Gospel of charity in every place, since the vocation to charity is the heart of all true evangelization. To this end I invoke the intercession of Mary, Mother of the Church and pray that she will accompany us on our Lenten journey. With these sentiments I affectionately impart to all my blessing.

## LENTEN CHARITY PROJECTS

Each year VESSC commits itself to fund projects as part of its Lenten charity activities. Donation boxes are available at the side entrance of the church after Sunday Mass. One of these projects is the support given to the education of street children. In this issue we present VESSC's involvement in CHILDSHOPE. The details of other Lenten Charity Projects will follow soon.

CHILDSHOPE Asia Philippines has been one of the beneficiaries of VESSC's Lenten Charity Projects. CHILDSHOPE works towards the liberation of the child from the suffering caused by working and living on the street. Street children who live in the street come from broken families, are abused, mistreated, exploited and are abandoned to their own fate. Unless society intervenes they grow and die on the street without knowing the meaning of a normal life.

The major intervention strategy to make street children to stand on their own two feet and lead a normal life is education. CHILDSHOPE is providing such an opportunity to young street children towards which VESSC has been contributing. The nature of this intervention requires consistency of support. We must make sure that the children going to school through our contribution should be given the opportunity to complete their education. Therefore, this year's charity project should be part of that continuity. This point has been emphasized by the coordinator appealing to VESSC to continue supporting the continuation of the education of the 6 students who have been under our support. The following letter is self-explanatory regarding the continuation of VESSC support for the students successfully attending school.

Dear Mr. Van Der Veen, Chairman of the VESSC Charity Committee:

**Re: A child's hope is in your hands**

*Thanks to the generous support of the VESSC in the year 2002, six street children from Metro Manila, Philippines, have been supported for their schooling for the school year (June) 2002 to (March) 2003. If you will recall, your donation of Euro 1,000.00 was transmitted to Childhope Asia Philippines (CHAP) in Manila and this was acknowledged by the Executive Director, Ms. Teresita Silva.*

*I am pleased to share with you a copy of the assessment of these six students, prepared by Miss Lorna D. Salen, the Social Worker who has been monitoring their performance in school and at home.*

*Your initial support covered the tuition and fees and basic school needs of these students for the first year of their high school studies. I am writing to appeal for the continuation of your support to enable them to proceed to the next year of the 4-years program. The amount involved is Euro 180.00 per student per school year or a total of Euro 1,080.00 for the six students.*

*Your continuing sponsorship is critical in enabling these students to continue their road to normalcy in their life. VESSC is giving hope to these children. Their education makes it possible to break the evil-circle of living in extreme poverty at the border of society. These children are then able to take a handle on their life, to gain self-confidence, to develop their potential for their own well being and for the well being of the society.*

**Pope John Paul II has called upon Christians to pray and fast for peace on Ash Wednesday, March 5.**

The pope said fasting that day should be an “expression of penitence for the hatred and violence that pollute human relations.” A peaceful future for the world cannot be won by terrorism or war, he said on Feb. 23.

The traditional abstinence from meat on the Fridays in Lent is encouraged by the Austrian Bishops, along with a freely chosen Lenten sacrifice according to individual conscience. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday remain days of fasting and abstinence with only one full meal; no eating between meals for ages 18 to 60 and no meat for age 14 and over.

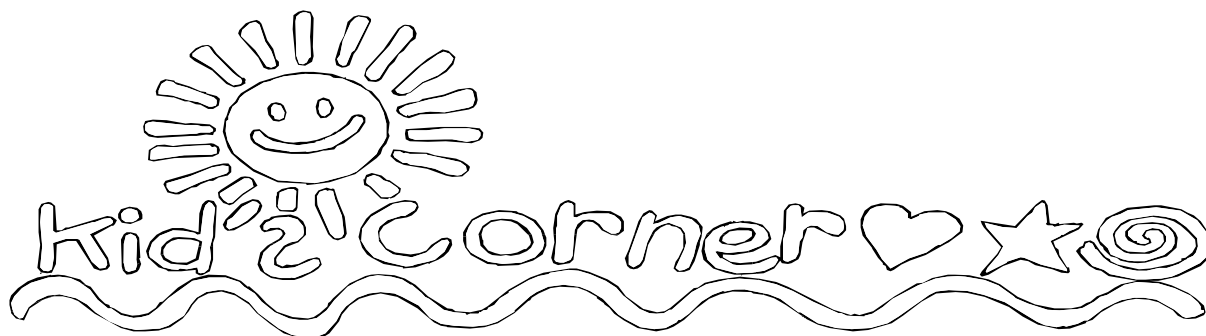

**Lent – An Ideal Season for Visiting Votive Museum**

The Votive Church houses one of the rarest old Gothic art treasure in the world, much older than the church itself. This is the Antwerp carved altar from the 1460s, also known as the Antwerp Passion Altar. The Altar consists of three reliefs: Carrying of the Cross; the Crucifixion of Christ; and the Mourning of Christ. Lent is a good time to visit the Passion Altar to admire its artistic beauty and to remind ourselves of the suffering of Christ for us. We recommend your visit. (entrance fee: € 2.90 for adults, children free)

## **How the VESCC Can Get Involved in Vienna's "Mission in the City" (Stadtmission) 2003**

Beginning 23 May through 1 June, 2003 Vienna will be the first city to host the annual International Congress for the New Evangelisation (ICNE) "Mission in the City". The streets, cafés, schools, churches, parks and train stations will be filled with people from all over the world spreading the Word of God. Conferences, workshops, concerts, banquets, and encounter sessions are planned to bring The Message to everyone. Cardinal Christoph Schönborn of Vienna has gotten 165 parishes, 20 international teams, 30 communities, including the Vienna English-Speaking Catholic Community, actors, politicians, sports personalities, artists, journalists and many others involved in this amazing project.

We are asking everyone involved in the VESCC to help make this first "Mission in the City" a successful one. Listed below are the key ways in which you can make a difference. If you are interested in volunteering in any of these areas please contact our VESCC *Stadtmission* liaison, Anamarija S. Sostaric at [anamarija.ss@chello.at](mailto:anamarija.ss@chello.at) or VESCC Council Member, Valerie Morris at 479-8058 or [taftmorris@aol.com](mailto:taftmorris@aol.com) for more information or to sign up.

- 1. Provide Bed and Breakfast Housing:** There are 20 students from the International Academy in Rome "School of Mission" who will need housing for two weeks from May 17-June 1. Their first week in Vienna will be devoted to the "Mission in the Schools" program organized by the ICNE. They will be talking to the AIS and VIS religious education classes as well as other schools in the city. During the second week they will be involved in the "Mission in the City" program. These students speak English and will be checked by the *Stadtmission* staff. Members of our community are asked to house at least two of these students for two or even one week and provide a morning meal.
- 2. Provide Evening Meals for Mission Team:** From May 18 to May 31 a team of 20 leaders (priest and staff from Franciscan University of Steubenville and Kerygma Teams) and college students are planning on staying with Fr. Kevin. This is the team that is going to be serving the English-speaking community with the event and any other things that we can think of during the mission. We need families from our community to provide one meal a day for this group and bring it to Fr.

Kevin's residence. This is an easy but important way to serve those who are directly serving the community.

- 3. Helping Organize the "Mission of Mercy" Event - Friday, May 30th at the "Christ, Hope for the World" Church:** This is the only all-English event and, as the largest international English-speaking Catholic Community, we are asked to help organize it. Chris and Michelle Benzinger from Kerygma Team here in Vienna have already rounded up some entertainment and activities for this event.

**18:00 International Dinner** for the students from Rome, the Mission Team, the Community, *Stadtmission* people and entertainers. Includes a testimony from members of the VESCC community preferably an adult and a teen. This would enhance the evening and bring the message a little closer to home.

- NEEDED:
1. Potluck dishes from as many members of the VESCC as possible.
  2. Help with set-up and clean-up.
  3. Testimonies from members of the VESCC community (Who is Jesus in my life? etc.).
  4. Attendance from VESCC families.

**19:00 "King's Kids"** perform (group of 25-30 kids ages 9-16 who sing, act, and bring Jesus to life). This program will last about 30 minutes and will include dances, drama, testimonies and crowd participation.

- NEEDED:
1. Help with set up and stage managing.
  2. Attendance from VESCC families.

**20:00 Festival of Praise:** high school/college/young adult age will be challenged and encouraged to take a deeper step in their faith in many different ways: Music - Praise and Worship, drama, testimonies from East and West (young adults from Russia, Slovakia, Belarus, Poland), message, Eucharistic procession and commitment to Jesus, follow up for people who commit (and even recommit) their lives to Jesus. This event will last about 2 hours. The night is modeled around the Saturday night sessions at the Steubenville Conferences where thousands of teens and young adults experience Christ in a powerful way. It is basically a huge prayer meeting where we use a variety of ways to help people encounter God.

NEEDED: 1. Help with set up and stage managing.  
2. Participation and attendance from VESCC high school students, college students and young adults.

4. **Host a "Home Discussion Evening" on Saturday, May 24th:** On this night there will be open house meetings. Vienna residents are asked to open their homes and invite their neighbors and friends (atheists and agnostics, especially). Two people from *Stadtmission* will come and discuss "God In The World". They will explain the idea of the *Stadtmission* and share their personal spiritual experience. VESCC members may host an event in their home.
5. **Sponsor a Missionary:** Members of our community can donate any or all of 300 Euros to sponsor a missionary attending this event.
6. **Learn the Official Hymn of the City Mission:** Like all the other parishes and communities in Vienna, VESCC will be singing the chosen hymn of this event during our Masses. *Stadtmission* has been kind enough to translate it from German into English and French.
